The City of Orland is celebrating its 100th birthday on September 4th, 5th and 6th. We hope to see you all come out and enjoy yourself and the festivities.

To kick things off, a Queen Pageant starts at Veteran's Memorial Hall at 6:00 pm. After the pageant, the official opening ceremonies will begin with a proclamation from the State of California. The evening ends with music and dance, a Battle of the Bands will be held at Lely Park starting at 9:00 pm. The Orland Art Gallery will also display local talent depicting Orland sights.

The next day, Saturday, September 5th starts off with a hearty breakfast at the Glenn County Fairgrounds at 8:00 am. The next item on the agenda is a parade featuring former Orland Mayors. Many of the past mayors, along with the current Mayor, will greet the parade watchers. Additionally, there will be floats and too numerous participants to mention. The parade is scheduled to begin at 10:00 am.

Message from the Planning/Building Department

California Title 24: 2008 Cool Roof Requirements

The Energy Commission adopted the 2008 CA Building Code Standards on April 23, 2008, and the State Building Standards Commission approved the Standards for publication on September 11, 2008.

The effective date for the 2008 Building Energy Efficiency Standards is January 1, 2010.

The requirement for when the 2008 Standards must be followed is dependent on when an application for a building permit is submitted. If an application is submitted on or after January 1, 2010, the 2008 Standards must be met.

Because cool roofs save both money and energy, in October 2005 they became part of the prescriptive requirements of California's Energy Code (Title 24 Building Energy Efficiency Standards). Most cool roof materials for low-sloped roofs are white or another light color. Because steep-sloped roofs are often visible from the ground, however, roofing material manufacturers have developed popular roof colors other than white that will still reflect or emit the sun's energy away from the building.

Cool roofs are highly reflective, highly emissive roofing materials that stay 50 to 60 degrees Fahrenheit cooler than a normal roof under a hot summer sun. Cool roofs can cut building owners' energy costs. Because cool roofs gain less heat than normal roofs, they reduce the need for air conditioning making buildings more comfortable for the residents inside.

Cool roofs have other benefits, too. For building owners they can cut maintenance costs and increase the life expectancy of the roof.

The cool roof requirements will apply to roofs on newly constructed buildings and to most reroofs on existing buildings. Roofs located over unconditioned spaces are exempt (i.e., garages); exceptions are available for insulation, reflective roof sheathing, and any reroof under 2,000 square feet or 50 percent of the roof, whichever is less.

This is only one of the energy requirements that will be going into effect on January 1, 2010. The City of Orland Building Division of the Community Services Department believes that this will be one of the most inquired Building Energy Efficiency Standards and we wanted to give the public a heads up on these upcoming Standards.

Important Message From The Police Chief E-MAIL AND BANKING – BEWARE – FRAUD / SCAM

We recently received a frightening e-mail from the bank. I have deleted the name of the bank and inserted "BANK NAME" in its place. The e-mail said:

"We at (BANK NAME) recently reviewed your account. We need more information to help us provide you with a secure service. Until we can collect this information, access to your account features will be restricted. We would like to restore your access as soon as possible, and we apologize for the inconvenience.

Your account access has been restricted for the following reason(s): 16 August 2009:

We have reason to believe that your account was accessed by a third party as different computers have logged into your Online Banking account and multiple password failures were presented before the logons.

We now need you to re-confirm your account information to us. We understand that having restricted access can be an inconvenience, but protecting your account is our primary concern.

Please visit the link below, log in to your account and complete the secure verification form:

In accordance with our User Agreement, your account access will remain restricted until the issue has been resolved. Unfortunately, if access to your account remains restricted for an extended period of time, we will be forced to close your account as it may have been used for fraudulent purposes.

We encourage you to log in to your Online Banking account as soon as possible to avoid this.

Please do not reply to this email. This mailbox is not monitored and you will not receive a response. © 1999 - 2009 (BANK NAME). All rights reserved.

This e-mail has all the triggers. Your money and security is at risk, a hacker, perhaps many hackers have accessed your account. Access to your own money is now restricted, if you don't do something fast your account will be closed, you know because the bank told you this would happen to protect you from fraud. Time is critical and you are urged to act promptly and on line to remedy the situation.

This letter would have been terribly frightening had it come from a firm with whom I had ever banked. Your first inclination is to go on line and straighten a mess like this out. DO NOT click on or access the link provided and NEVER provide any confidential information or account information in these circumstances. If you receive a letter like this; print a copy and take it directly to the local branch of your bank and ask about the validity of the letter. Ask and answer questions directly to your banker never on line and never by e-mail. This is one more way that Orland Police Department is helping you "PROTECT YOURSELF."

Message from Your Public Works Department

As you are sweeping your driveway and sidewalks (because you are saving money on your water bill), remember to place only small items in the gutter pan for the City sweeper. The sweeper can pick up dirt and small debris but save your limbs and grass clippings for the City's Green Waste dump site. For those of you who have not taken advantage of this service, the green waste dump site can be found at County Road 21 and N (maps to the site are available at City Hall). Please keep in mind you are driving on county roads and passing by homeowners who don't need your green waste on their property so, tarp your materials.

The City will start the fall leaf pick-up in November. Due to budget constraints, it is not known at this time whether the City Council will authorize a green waste pick-up in the coming months. Look for a message on your next water bill to find out if the green waste pick-up will be conducted. In the meantime, take advantage of the City's green waste dump for all of your pruning and yard clippings.

Sixth Street Construction – Sixth Street will be repaved and worked on the same way it was done on South Street. The start date is anticipated to begin mid-October. This project is part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, and funded with stimulus funds from the federal government. The project will stretch from the city limits at the north to the city limits to the south, a length of 7,630 linear feet. Will give you updates in the October newsletter.
