Citizen Comments:

PUBLIC HEARING

Conduct a public hearing and upon conclusion introduce first reading by title only and consider passage of Ordinance No. 2018-XX to amend Title 17 to include State requirements for Accessory Dwelling Units.

City Planner Friend gave a report advising the City will need to revise Title 17 to comply with the new California statutes regarding Accessory Dwelling Units (second units). The State of California identified there is a housing shortage, mainly in the urban areas and this would be the quickest way to bring in new homes. Second dwelling units can be a back home, detached house, addition to an existing home or modifications to an existing structure. The criteria requires the building to have eating, sleeping, and sanitation facilities, as well as a separate exterior door and one parking space which could be tandem. The owner must occupy either the primary or secondary home. The minimum and maximum floor size of a second unit and setbacks were also identified.

The public hearing opened at 7:10 p.m. Byron Denton, 127 Tanner Way, asked if will we have to comply with the new State law. Mr. Friend confirmed you do have to comply with the new State law, however, the Planning Commission did recommend two local changes: 1) an owner occupancy requirement and 2) conversions of existing structure can be done ministerially. Trish Saint-Evens asked if there was a minimum or maximum lot size requirement. Mr. Friend stated second dwelling units are exempted from the calculation of density; only have to meet a five (5) foot setback, regardless of how tall they are. With no further comments, the public hearing closed at 7:12 p.m.

Council discussed. Vice Mayor Roundy stated it's an inexpensive way to solve the housing shortage problem.

reading by title only of Ordinance No. 2018-XX, amending Title 17 of the Orland Municipal Code to comply with State law regarding Accessory Dwelling Units. The motion carried 3-

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS

A. Discuss paid Fire Chief concept—Pete Carr, City Manager

City Manager Carr requested Council discussion and to consider concepts related to compensating the Orland Fire Chief. The Orland Volunteer Fire Department (OVFD) has served the Orland area community with unpaid volunteer services. Over the years, the time required for training and recordkeeping have increased significantly, thus, recognizing the need for a paid fire chief. Fire Chief Chaney stated there has been a lack of anyone wanting to volunteer for the fire chief position. Mr. Carr and Councilmember Paschall are currently examining other jurisdictions' model formats to consider (job description, compensation, recruiting, JPA, cost share formulas, leadership and management of processes). Fire

Chief Chaney stated both OVFD and Orland Rural Fire Protection District would like to see a volunteer from within the organization hired for the position. Jack Bucke, retired OVFD volunteer, stated its important to the community to choose the right person. Fire Chief Chaney stated if a Joint Powers Agreement was formed, both the City and the ORFPD could share a 50/50% interest. Mayor Gee stated he had concerns the City could potentially lose their fire insurance rating, if no action was taken. Byron Denton stated a salary needs to be one of the first considerations. Council discussed and agreed it is time to fund a paid fire chief, but it needs to be done effectively and proficiently.

Council directed City Manager Carr and Councilmember Paschall to work with the ORFPD board and OVFD to bring forward some decisions regarding concept for a paid fire chief.

B. Consider draft argument in favor of Measure E- Pete Carr, City Manager

Mr. Carr presented Council with a draft Hotel User Tax statement in favor of Measure E. Measure E will be placed on the November ballot proposing an increase in the HUT from 10% to 12%. Mr. Carr spoke to Ron Braga, Orland Inn owner, who advised he was not supportive of Measure E since all the monies go to the General Fund, rather than Chamber of Commerce or economic development activities.
