### ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS

City Manager Carr brought forward discussion on economic incentives for hotel development. The Economic Development Commission recommended the City should offer specific incentives in the form of Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) rebates to the current pending hotel project developer/property owner (SKP Ranch) to spur ground-breaking sooner, rather than later. Mr. Carr advised the property owner indicated he was very interested in incentives that may be offered. Mr. Carr stated the City would not incur any out of pocket expense as the incentive is based on TOT. The following options were discussed:

- If developer breaks ground on X date + 120 days, 3% TOT rebate for 3 years
- If developer breaks ground on X date + 150 days, 2% TOT rebate for 2 years
- If developer breaks ground on X date + 180 days, 1% TOT rebate for 1 year

Council discussed and stated that other developers may want incentives for their projects. City Attorney Einhorn stated the Council's decision is not binding for all future hotel/motel developments; only being considered for this specific project; it is a benefit to the City. Council expressed the City will not receive any TOT monies, unless the project gets started. Jody Samons, Glenn County Business Services, stated she supports the proposal and Council should take a precedent. Ms. Samons suggested the incentive should include that the hotel will be open within 12 months of groundbreaking.

City Manager Carr requested Council to discuss constructing sections of fencing for the north end of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Streets which borders an open irrigation canal. There have been serious issues in the past with unintended access to the irrigation canals owned by the Orland Unit Water Users Association. Mr. Carr suggested cyclone fencing could be added along the City right-of-way, within the city limits, between existing privately owned wood fences. Appropriate signage would be placed in the middle of the fence to alert drivers. Estimated cost of fencing is \$13,500. Councilmember Roundy proposed Measure A funds pay for the cost of fencing; not all Councilmembers agreed. It was noted the OUWUA is not considering sharing in the cost of the fencing. Chief of Police Tolle felt fencing should also be considered along Roosevelt Avenue, near the pool. The City's insurance carrier, Golden Risk Management Authority, was not opposed to the fencing. Mr. Carr acknowledged that the fencing is intended to reduce the likelihood of accidental entry of pedestrians and vehicles into the canals, but will not absolutely prevent an occurrence from being possible. City Attorney Einhorn stated the measures being proposed would be inadmissible to any future accident; inaction would be admissible.

Councilmember Edwards moved, seconded by Councilmember Paschall to proceed with constructing sections of fencing for the north end of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Streets, costing up to \$13,500 from General Fund monies and to proceed in incremental steps to analyze the costs of constructing additional fencing further down Roosevelt Avenue across from the pool. The
