Citizen Comments:

Alexander Richardson, 4429 Tropetros Lane, on behalf of Boy Scout Troop #4, advised they were all currently working on their "citizenship in the community" merit badge requirement.

Mary Rose Kennedy, Chairperson of the Orland Tree Committee, gave an oral report. Mrs. Kennedy stated the committee came up with an approved Orland Tree list that they wish to be posted on the City website. The Committee has focused on downtown Fourth Street and recommended to plant large shade trees down the middle of Fourth Street. The old brick has been removed and would be replaced with bark. Mendon's Nursery gave an approximate estimate of \$90 for a 10 gallon tree. A generous donation of \$1,300 was given from the retired Orland Business Improvement Association to assist in the purchase of new trees. Mrs. Kennedy advised they would need approximately 8 trees. Council discussed they did not want messy tree droppings or anything possibly blocking the front of the businesses. Council directed the committee to work with the Public Works Director to begin planting of trees.

Presentation:

J.C. Tolle, Chief of Police gave an annual report on the Police Department. Activities and calls for service have decreased a bit since last year, however, reports and arrests have increased. There were 406 adults arrested (Felony-114, Misdemeanor – 292, DUI – 59, Drug related-65). Chief Tolle stated accidents have jumped up 25% since last year, with more traffic on Walker Street. Police officers have been enforcing speed with radar. Speed has been a problem on Sixth Street near the arch and in the early morning hours on Walker Street. The K-9 program had 54 deployments with dogs Miky and Ruger. K-9 funds are all strictly donations. Volunteers in Police Services have volunteered over 2448 hours for 2016. VIPS have assisted with events, traffic control, call outs, parades, trainings and fundraisers. Chief Tolle advised social media has been used to stay in touch with the community for both the K9 unit and OPD. National Night Out and Coffee with a Cop are occasions that community members can come out and visit with the local law enforcement.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS

Public Works Director Vonasek and Chief of Police Tolle presented recommendations from the Public Works and Safety Commission. Mr. Vonasek advised the Commission discussed the dangers of the crosswalk at Sixth and Monterey Streets and recommended a flashing pedestrian sign in both the north and southbound direction. A four-way stop was also recommended for the intersection of Fourth Street and Suisun Street. Mr. Vonasek stated Monterey and Fourth Street is also an area that was identified. Roy Meredith mentioned with no stop signs on Sixth Street from the light to the arch, cars speed through this area. A citizen who lives on the corner of Monterey and Sixth Street expressed a concern of the pedestrian crossing. Council discussed there is a need for flashing pedestrian signs on both sides of Sixth and Monterey Street.

City Manager Carr requested Council to consider traffic controls for State Route 32 (Newville Road) for both the east and west sides of Interstate 5. A traffic study competed by KD Anderson warranted stop signs in the subject area. Caltrans accepted the study and requested the City to proceed with an encroachment permit application. The City Engineer, Director of Public Works and Chief of Police all recommend an all-

way stop on both the east and west sides of the overpass. Councilmembers Gee, Edwards, and Paschall stated it was practical and consistent to consider an all- way stop.

Public Works Director Vonasek and Recreation Director Fenske brought forward a recommendation to replace the pool chlorinator with new equipment. The current system has caused ongoing maintenance issues with the Public Works department depending on the hot weather and the number of swimmers utilizing the pool. It has caused the system to shut down and the need to add more chemicals and reprograming the computer. Staff recommends upgrading to the Pulsar 500 which triples the amount of chlorine tablets the system currently holds.

The Recreation Commission is recommending to sunset the operations of the baby pool due to maintenance difficulties and create alternatives in the baby pool area. City staff and the Recreation Commission have proposed a family picnic area with possible barbeque and shade cover and water play structures (i.e. water slide, rock wall, etc.) for the main pool. Council discussed the upkeep is not practical at the baby pool anymore.

City Manager Carr brought forward State Transportation Funding legislation related to street repair funding. The City recently sent letters of support for SB1 (Beale) and AB1 (Frazier) regarding State funding for transportation, as per the advice of the League of California Cities. The League has not indicated support or opposition to AB 496 or AB 174. Vice Mayor Roundy stated the City should support and watch AB 1 and SB1 and watch AB 496. Mayor Hoffman and Councilmembers Gee and Edwards stated they are opposed to AB1 and SB1. Trish Saint-Evens stated the City should follow the recommendation of the League of California Cities.
