PUBLIC HEARING

Project #ZCA 2020-01: A City-initiated rezoning action to change the zoning on three (3) existing parcels identified as Glenn County Assessor Parcel Numbers 045-170-042, 045-170-040 and 045-170-041 and further identified as 4463, 4473, and 4483 Commerce Lane as follows:

- 1) Determine that the project is Exempt from further environmental review pursuant to Government Code Section 15061(b)(3);
- Approve an Ordinance changing the zoning on the subject parcels from the O-S, Open Space zone to the C-H, Highway Service Commercial zoning district.

Mr. Carr reviewed the City Planner's staff report regarding the City's proposed rezoning of three parcels from O-S Open Space to C-H Highway Service Commercial. The three parcels total +/- 5.56 acres and are located within the City boundaries at 4463,4473, and 4483 Commerce Lane, Orland. The parcels are served by existing City water, sewer and roadway infrastructure located in the adjacent Commerce Lane. The County Assessor's Parcel Numbers are 045-170-041, -042, and -040.
