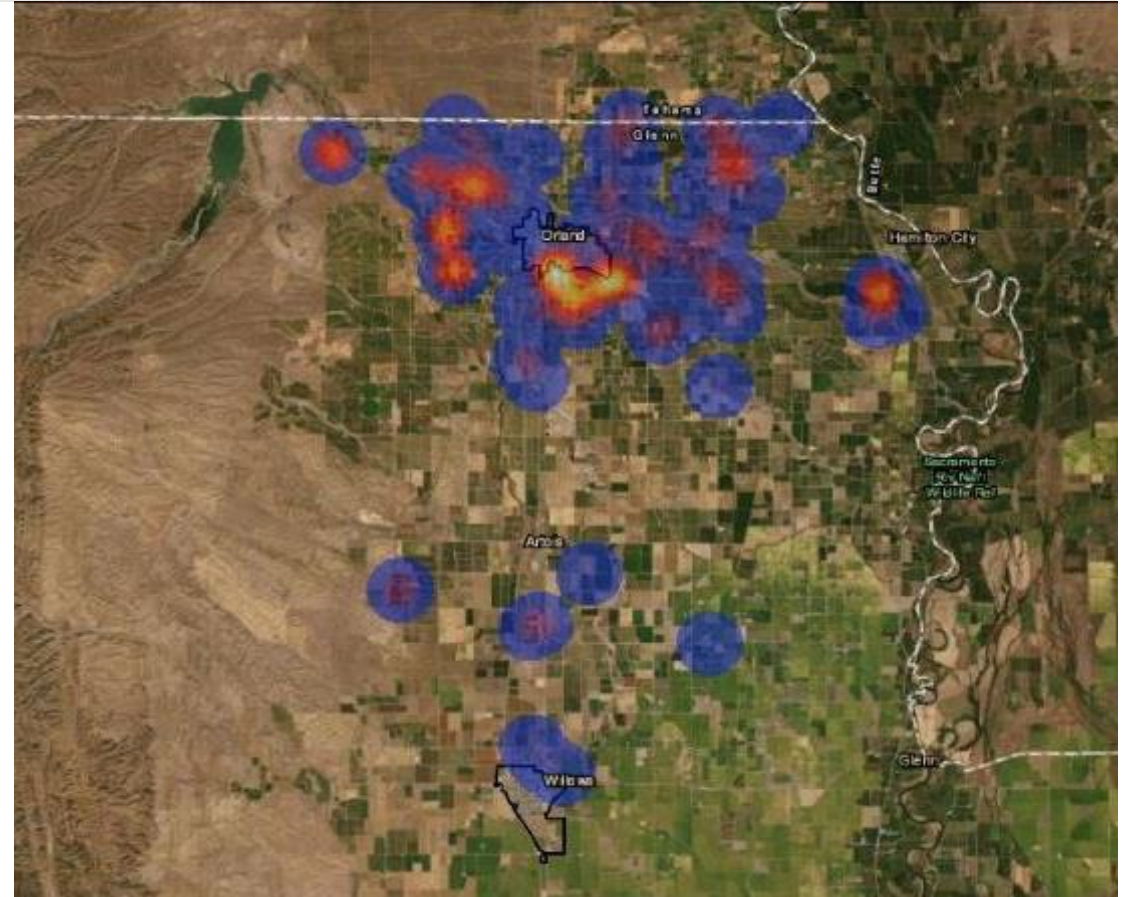


# Glenn County Drought Status



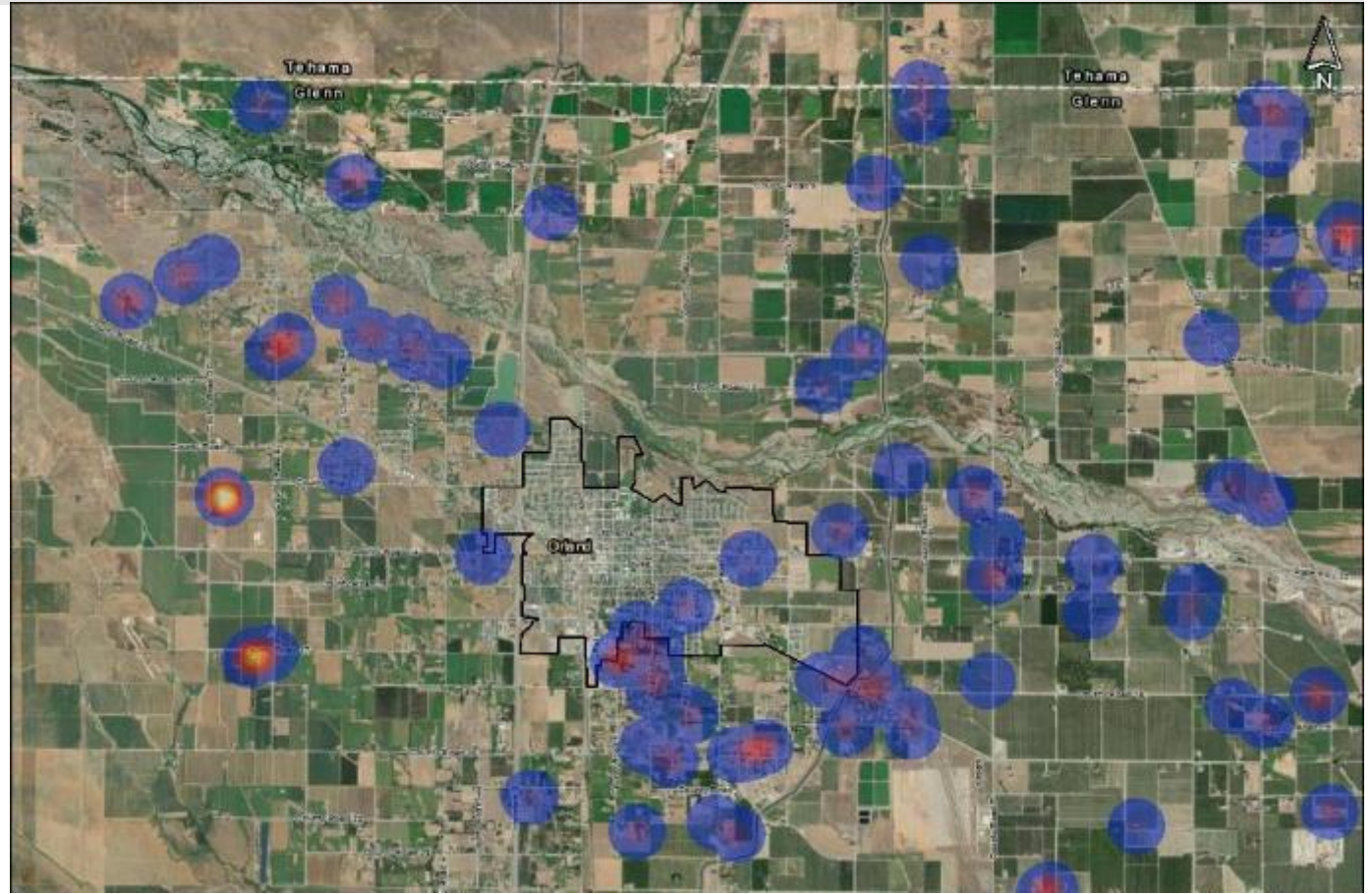
# Glenn County Heat Map

- One of the hardest areas hit by current drought
- **166** dry wells
- **82** additional wells with water supply issues



# Orland Area Heat Map

- 59 dry wells
- 41 additional wells with water supply issues



# Drought Assistance



# Drought Assistance

- **Emergency Drought Funding – Department of Water Resources**
  - \$200 million for **Small Community Drought Relief Program**
  - Small Communities not served by urban water systems eligible
- **North Valley Community Foundation**
  - Commitment for **\$1.9 Million**
- **City of Orland**
  - Commitment for **\$7.7 Million**



# Short-Term Solution

## ➤ Glenn County Hauled Water Project

- Funds committed by DWR to NVCF
- For entire Glenn County

## ➤ Provide immediate relief up to 12 months:

- Hauled water
- Bottled water

## ➤ Interim Solution but not sustainable long-term





# Long-Term Solution

## ➤ Orland Area Water Supply Project

- Funds committed by DWR to City of Orland
- Area around City of Orland

## ➤ Provide long term relief:

- Home connections
- Construct new well with a storage tank
- Connect the new well to the existing water system

# Orland Area Water Supply Project

- Connecting to City of Orland Water Supply System
- Expand and extend water distribution system
  - Construct a new well with a storage tank
  - Connect the new well to the existing water system
  - Booster Pump
- Connect everyone interested
- Priority based on dry wells reported

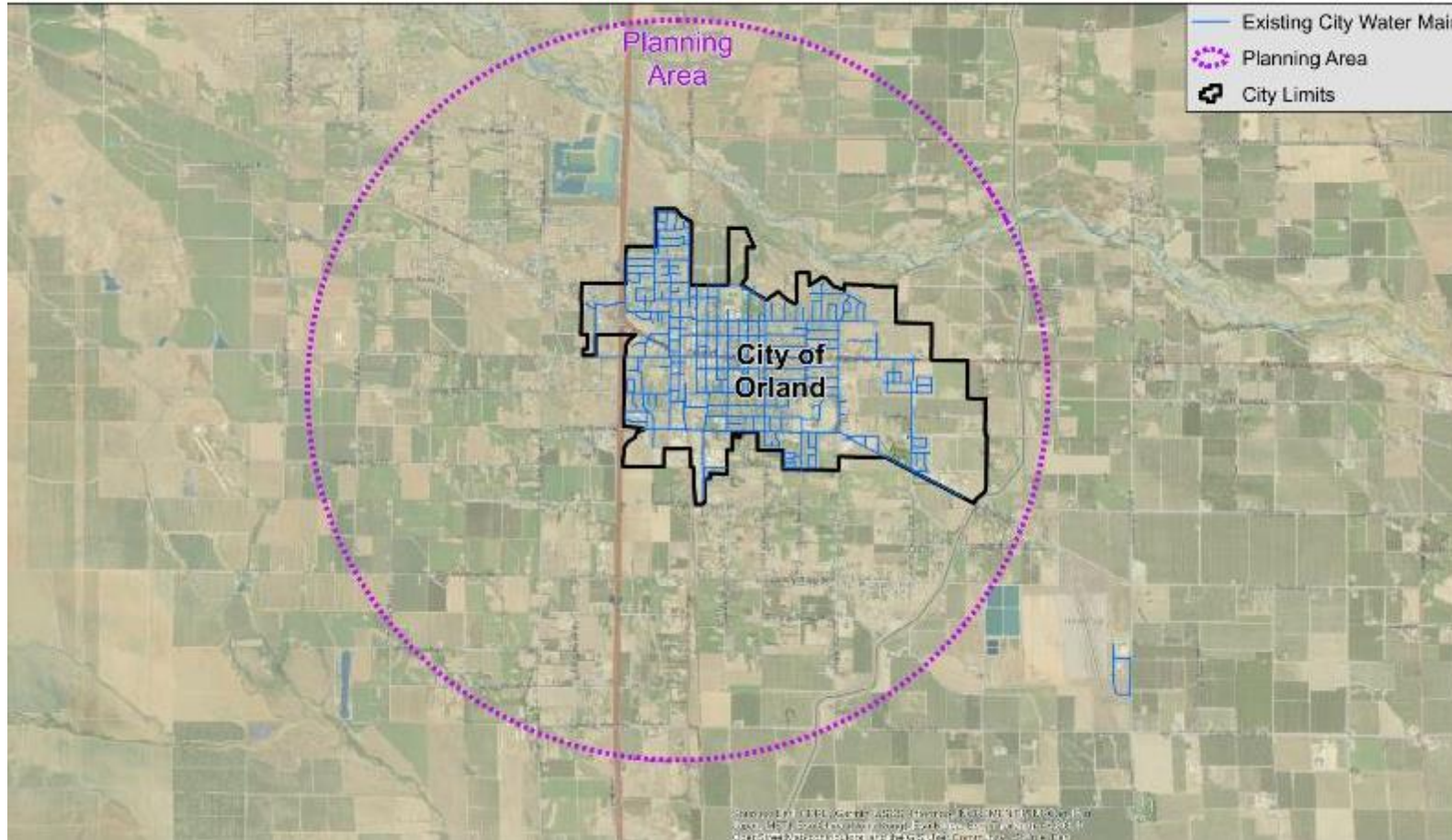

### Notes

- (1) Total Wells is the sum of the Reported Dry Wells and Reported Wells with Other Water Supply Issue
- (2) Reported Dry Wells are the wells reported to the County indicated as "dry"
- (3) Reported Wells with Other Water Supply Issues are wells that were reported to the County that have issues other than "dry"
- (4) Expression of Interest (EOI) are residents who indicated an interest in connecting the City water



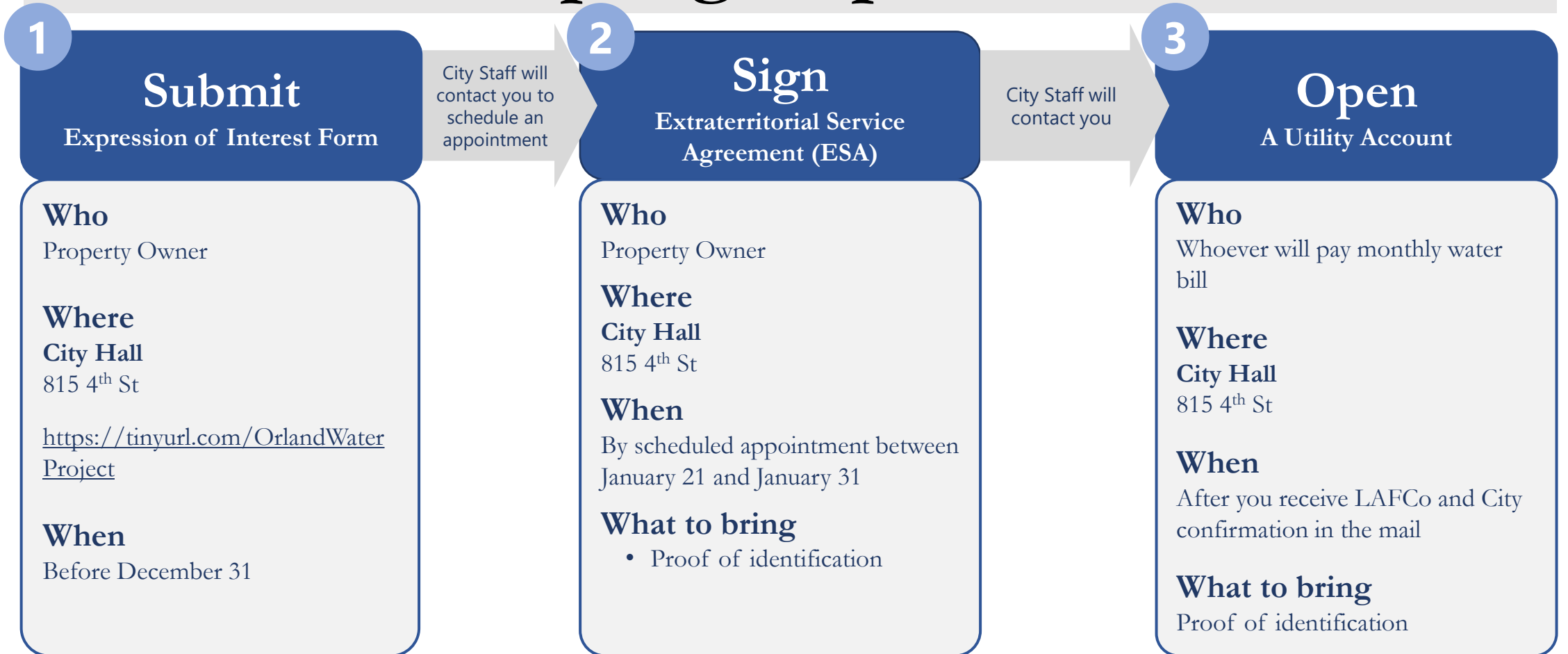

# FAQs

## ➤ What is the Project Area?

- Depends on dry wells locations reported and ESA's received
- Report - <https://tinyurl.com/GlennDryWell>

## ➤ Who can connect?

- Residential property with a house within the Project Area
  - Dry Well Households
  - Other Households based on Project alignment
  - Empty lots are not eligible to connect

# FAQs

## ➤ What is included as part of the connection?

- Water Mains
- Connections to households  
(most homes)
- Water Meter
- Back Flow Preventer

# FAQs

## ➤ What is the cost of connection?

- Free – most cases

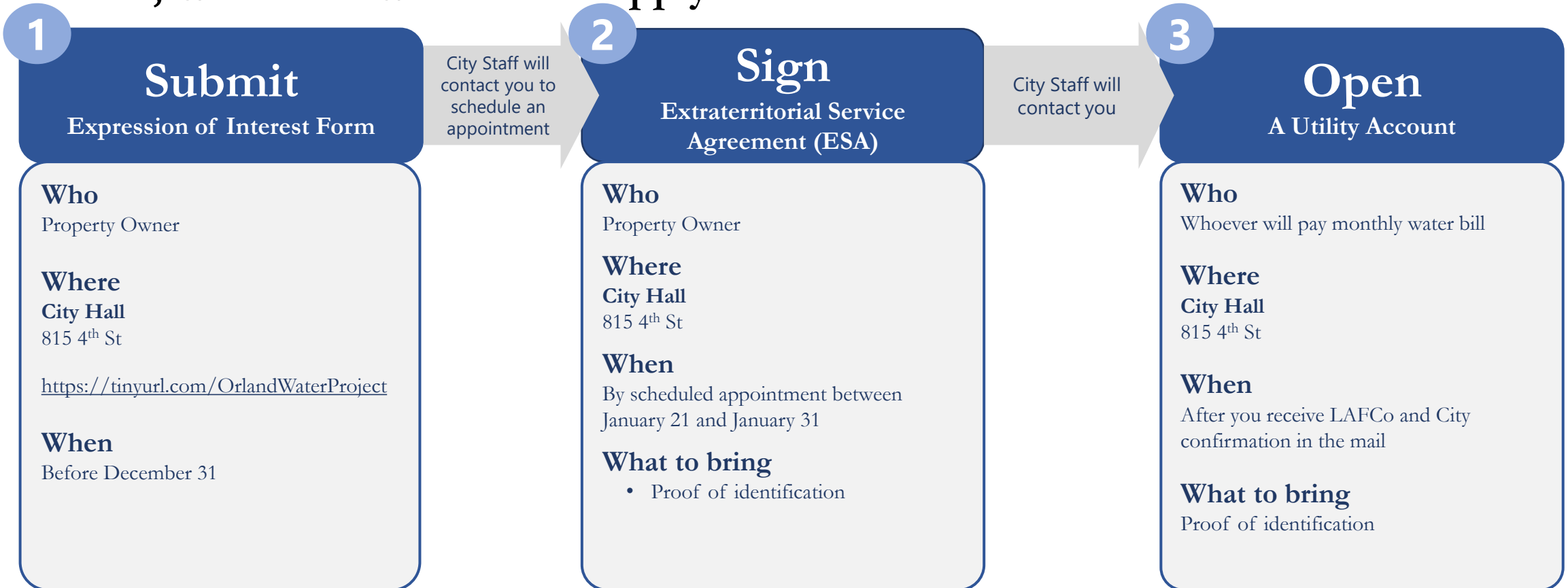
## ➤ What are the water rates?

- \$126.62 bi-monthly ( = \$63.31 per month)
  - for the first 15,000 gallons bi-monthly
  - above 15,000 gallons - \$1.70 per 1,000 gallons

# FAQs

## ➤ **What is the timeline of the Project?**

- Determined once the project area is determined
- Project area is determined based on ESA's received

## ➤ **If I connect, will I be annexed by the City now?**

- City currently has no intention or plan to annex now nor in the foreseeable future

## ➤ **By connecting, do I give up my right to protest annexation?**

- Yes, this is a common and longstanding agreement when municipal services are extended into unincorporated areas as required by LAFCo





# FAQs

- **If I connect, do I need to destroy/abandon my well?**
  - No; if you keep your well, you will need a backflow preventer.
  
- **If I chose to destroy my well, will the project cover the expenses?**
  - Yes
  
- **Can I connect to the City of Orland sewer system?**
  - No, that is not part of this project
