MINUTES OF THE ORLAND CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING HELD JANUARY 3, 2023

Mayor Chris Dobbs stated that Staff acknowledged that the date (2022) was incorrect on the meeting agenda for January 3, 2023.

Action: Vice Mayor Roundy moved, seconded by Councilmember Romano, to approve the consent calendar as presented. The motion carried by a voice vote 4-0.

PUBLIC HEARING

Zoning Ordinance Text Amendment (ZCA 2022-01) - Reasonable Accommodations

Mr. Friend presented an introduction and first reading of a proposed amendment to the City of Orland's Municipal Code (OMC) to incorporate changes to the City Code resulting from changes to State and Federal law regarding reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities or medical conditions necessitating the granting of a Reasonable Accommodation Request (RAR). Mr. Friend stated that this item is an amendment to the Orland Municipal Code (OMC) adding a new section into the code 17.72

FENTANYL PRESENTATION – GLENN COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER DR. JARED GARRISON

Dr. Jarrod Garrison, Glenn County Health Officer, presented information on fentanyl, hoping to bring attention to the drug and awareness to the drug use, overdose, and deaths.

Dr. Garrison presented data on U.S. Drug- induced death rate by drug type over the past 20 years showing that fentanyl is quickly on the rise resulting in 62% of all overdose deaths in America. Dr. Garrison shared that a grain of salt weighs about 60 micrograms and explained that fentanyl the size of 3 grains of salt can be lethal, which is equal to taking 24 Vicodin.

Dr. Garrison gave data and examples of fentanyl overdoses and deaths that are happening not only in California but in Glenn and surrounding Counties. Dr. Garrison showed pictures of what fentanyl looks like, in some cases brightly colored called rainbow fentanyl, different bright colors making the drug look like candy, and explained how some are even transporting the drug in kids toy boxes.

Dr. Garrison spoke about Narcan nasal spray and fentanyl test strips explaining how to use them and where anyone can locally pick it up. Dr. Garrison stated he hopes in the future the Orland Library will be a spot in town that has Narcan nasal spray and fentanyl test strips available for the community.

Dr. Garrison shared stories from people who have passed away from a fentanyl overdoses. Dr. Garrison explained 5 things to do to prevent overdose death is 1. Educate, 2. Learn the signs of overdoes, 3. Carry Narcan, 4. Test for fentanyl and 5. Never use alone.

Councilmember McDermott asked currently if someone in the community needed Narcan nasal spray or fentanyl test strips tomorrow where could they get them. Dr. Garrison shared that items could be picked up at Harmony House, Substance Abuse, Mental Health Department and Orland Pharmacy for free. Councilmember McDermott stated that everyone should make sure they have Narcan on hand because you may think it isn't happening in your own family, but you never know and it is better to be safe.

Mayor Dobbs asked City Librarian Jody Meza if she was consulted about having Narcan nasal spray and fentanyl test strips available at the library. Ms. Meza shared that City Manager Pete Carr had mentioned it to her and stated that after listening to this presentation she felt the information was very helpful and with City Council and the City Manager's approval she approved of having the products available to the community.

Councilmember Romano stated his concerns with what will happen to Library Park and the surrounding neighbors if the Library starts to freely pass out Narcan. Dr. Garrison shared that Council would be surprised by who actual would come in to get the Narcan, people in your community that you would not expect.

Kylie Paulos, Orland resident, shared her story as a concerned citizen and grieving aunt about her nephew who died of a fentanyl poisoning. Ms. Paulos hopes her family's story will help get the word out about the unknown dangers of fentanyl and hopes that the City will consider allowing the Narcan nasal spray and fentanyl test strips to be available for the community to help save live.

Library Director Meza presented a slide show on the status of the library for the 2021/2022 year. Ms. Meza showed a picture of the front entrance of the library and stated that the Library has been funded to get touch-free doors through recent grants and hopes that this project will be completed within the next year.

Ms. Meza stated that the library is lucky enough to have the support from community and partnerships with local donors, Friends of the Library, Orland Rotary, Orland Women's Improvement Club and Glenn County Farm Bureau.

Ms. Meza shared that staffing levels have gone down (3 full-time and 4 part-time), but open hours have gone up and they are maintaining well due to combining positions, bringing in new data bases and software.

Ms. Meza spoke about projects that have been completed at the Library in 2022 including combining catalogs and circulation systems between Orland and Willows, a new website specifically for the Library and the Palace Project Statewide Digital Collection.

Ms. Meza stated the library has been able to receive \$12,731.00 in Zip Books (739 books and audiobooks), a grant for \$12,000.00 for Learning2Go Literacy Kits, \$5,874.00 in Library Broadband Connectivity support, \$3600.00 for Lunch with the Library Summer Program, \$2500.00 for Parks Pass Adventure Backpacks & Telescopes, \$2100.00 for Staff development and Training funds and \$2,000.00 for First5 Children's Services stipend.

The total library users are 10,928; out of this number 5,354 are within the City and 5,246 are in the County, 328 are non-residents.

Vice Mayor Roundy thanked Ms. Meza for all she does for the Library and community.

Councilmember McDermott asked if the City receives support from the County since the Library also serves a lot of their residents. Ms. Meza shared that the City and County have been working toward a 50/50 agreement and shared that the County is working toward reaching that goal.

Councilmember Dobbs thanked Ms. Meza for doing a great job with the library and stated the City is lucky to have her on staff.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS

WELL CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT BID - CITY ENGINEER PAUL RABO

City Engineer Paul Rabo reminded Council that the City of Orland is working with the State of California Department of Water Resources (DWR) to construct improvements to the City's water system to benefit residents inside and outside City limits. Mr. Rabo stated that the improvements to the system will include a new groundwater well, storage tank and water mains and would be located inside and out of the City.

Mr. Rabo shared that the first part of the project to be advertised is the first phase of a new groundwater well located on Walker Street near Interstate 5. Mr. Rabo stated that the project was advertised in November and bids were opened on December 6, 2022, with a total of three bids

Nar Heer of Nor-Cal Pump & Well Drilling stated his company followed all the procedures and felt that the lowest bidder has not. Mr. Heer presented the Council with Well Industries, Inc response to their protest letter.

Mayor Dobbs asked if City Attorney Greg Einhorn had seen this letter prior to the meeting and if he had any comments for Council on it. Mr. Einhorn reviewed the letter and explained that it had to do with the two issues that Nor-Cal Pump & Well Drilling spoke about at the last meeting: the missing addendum that was categorized as a minor clerical error, and issue with the mobilization/demobilization being bid incorrectly. Mr. Dobbs asked from a legal stand point does the City need to be aware of anything if they decide to choose the lowest bidder. Mr. Einhorn reminded Council that City Council has the discretion to waive clerical errors and other minor irregularities in the bid. Mr. Einhorn shared that he felt the lowest bidder was responsive and the bidder is responsible.

Nar Heer stated that in the protest letter the lowest bidder is still over the 10% that is listed on the RFP and that the lowest bidder is still not following the guidelines.

Ron Stilwell, President of Well Industries, Inc., stated if another bidder is chosen, he will not take legal action against the City.

Alberto Vasquez, Director of Operations for Nor-Cal Pump & Well Drilling stated his concerns for the lowest bidder being given multiple chances to get information in after the due date and the bidder not being responsible. Mr. Vasquez stated that giving the lowest bidder multiple chances is neither fair or competitive to all bidders involved.

Councilmember Romano commented that the job at hand is to drill a well, the City is looking for the best well driller at the best price. Mr. Romano stated if the bidder can come to the meeting and put their name behind their work then he is satisfied with the bid.

Action: Councilmember Romano moved, seconded by Vice Mayor Roundy that City Council waive the irregularities in the low bid and award a construction contract for the City of Orland Walker Street Well Project to Well Industries Inc. and authorize the City Manager to execute the contract and all other documents necessary to complete the project. Upon voice vote, the motion carried 4-0.

The minutes of the October 19, 2022 meeting were approved as emailed with no corrections or additions (motion made by Paddy Turnbull, seconded by Steve Elliott - motion carried). The Financial Report covering October $1 \sim 31$, 2022 provided by Letty Espinosa was reviewed and filed for audit.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS AND UPDATES:

- 1. Commissioner Rae Turnbull reported that the November First Friday Special Event which featured two talented young pianists who are also brothers was highly successful and drew a very large and supportive crowd.
- 2. The commission will look forward to hearing commissioner Jim Scribner's report at the next meeting on plans to repair the rainwater damage to the ceiling in a short hallway in the back portion of the gallery, and his update on a proposed new roof scheduled for the historic Masonic Lodge building in which the Orland Art Gallery is housed. Keeping the city's historic buildings well maintained is a great benefit to the city's downtown area.
- 3. Commissioner Paddy Turnbull reported that the gallery plans to participate in the Chamber of Commerce Christmas Previews event on November 26 by passing out candy canes to passers-by and visitors.
- 4. Commissioner Steve Elliott reported that flags he ordered for the gallery entrance (to make people more aware of the gallery shows and events) have arrived, and he will put them together and bring them to the gallery.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND ACTION:

- 1. Commissioner Steve Elliott made a motion (seconded by Mary Rose Kennedy motion carried) to raise the rate for gallery Christmas decorating to \$450.
- 2. The timing of repairs in the short hallway in the back portion of the gallery (required because of the rainwater damage to the ceiling) was discussed and consensus was reached that any time after the second week in December will work.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:24 p.m.

CITY COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 2023-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ORLAND APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO TITLE 17- ZONING OF THE ORLAND MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 17.18 – REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS, TO INCORPORATE ELEMENTS OF STATE AND FEDERAL LAW REGARDING REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES; TO SUPPORT THE CALIFORNIA FAIR EMPLOYMENT AND HOUSING ACT, THE FEDERAL FAIR HOUSING ACT, AND THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

WHEREAS, at its regular meeting held on November 17, 2022, the Planning Commission of the City of Orland conducted a noticed public hearing to consider and discuss a proposed amendment to the Orland Municipal Code consolidating and addressing the subject matter of Reasonable Accommodations;

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Orland, after the conduct of the noticed public hearing and following the consideration and discussion of the matter, recommended language be incorporated into the proposed amendment and voted unanimously 4-0 to forward the draft Ordinance to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2023 at a regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council, the draft Ordinance was presented for its first reading and introduction to the City Council, and, after discussion of the matter, the City Council directed staff to return the matter to the City Council for a duly noticed public hearing; and

WHEREAS, at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting of January 17, 2023, the City Council conducted a noticed public hearing to consider an amendment to Title 17 - Zoning of the Orland Municipal Code making changes to the City Code to incorporate elements of State and Federal laws regarding reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities and consolidating reasonable accommodation request information into a single, more convenient location in the Code; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Commission has made a recommendation to the City Council that the proposed action is *exempt* from further environmental review pursuant to California Government Code Section 15061(b)(3), known as the "General Rule" or "Common Sense Exemption" as it has been determined that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed Municipal Code Amendment would have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, after the conduct of the public hearing the City Council voted 4-0 to approve the proposed amendment to the Orland Municipal Code Amendment adding a new Section 17.18- *Reasonable Accommodation* as presented (staff report attachment A).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Orland does hereby approve Orland Municipal Code Amendment ZCA 2023-01 and making the determination that the action is exempt from further review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Government Code Section 15061(b)(3).

Mid-year Budget Review (Discussion/Action)

Staff will update the Council on budget revenues and expenditures midway through the fiscal year.

BACKGROUND

The 2022-23 fiscal year budget was adopted in June 2022 and became effective July 1, 2022. Due to the normal seasonality and limited predictability of some revenue sources and expense categories, as well as uncertain and deferred State allocations of certain tax revenues, it is expected that not all budget categories will be at 50% at the fiscal year mid-point. Several necessary assumptions and projections are included in the analysis.

This review is intended to summarize our position so far, this fiscal year compared to budget, and to provide an opportunity to make course corrections if needed. This discussion will include the General Fund, Measure A and major utility funds.

DISCUSSION

General Fund Revenues and Expenditures

General Fund revenues overall are positive at 6% over budget plan, with sales tax and property tax providing the bulk of income and both on track.

- Sales tax is 7% (\$165k) over budget while property tax is per plan.
- Building Dept revenue is 14% ahead of budget projection; Building Dept expenditures are 8% below expected.
- The County's library cost share increased 5% this year after the budget was adopted.

General Fund expenditures overall are about 5% under budget at this point, providing a net cushion.

 Police Dept operations comprise 46% of the General Fund expenses and are running at 10% below budgeted expenditure.

General Fund Bottom Line

With \$3.3M in $\frac{1}{2}$ yr. revenues against \$2.4M in $\frac{1}{2}$ yr. expenditures, the net of revenue vs expenditure at mid-point in the year is very positive and does not require or suggest unplanned mid-year budget changes. The net gain should be held in reserve as a hedge against risk. A surplus at the end of the

fiscal year, if any, will be needed to help achieve and maintain the General Fund 's target reserve balance.

Measure A Public Safety Revenue and Expenditures

Measure A, with revenue coming in 6% (\$82k) ahead of its fiscal year budget, is its own separate fund with its own annual fiscal report. Measure A expenditures are running 33% ahead of budget but this is not an operational budget with personnel compensation, so the imbalance reflects planned equipment purchases for the 12-mo fiscal year which were made during the first six months of the fiscal year. It will not be a problem to end up balanced in this fund for the fiscal year.

We do have one correction to the Measure A budget we need to make in that the \$15k approved for Fire Department "Facility & Equipment Maintenance & Improvements (Budget page 6) was presented to Council in work sessions as \$55k, then in subsequent edits and revisions inadvertently misstated as \$15k when it came to final budget adoption. \$55,000 is needed for this expense category. Given the pace of revenue, the fund will still be managed to a balance for the fiscal year.

ARPA Funds are being tracked separately and will be reported at fiscal year-end. All expected revenue was received at once and expenditures are occurring as authorized by Council.

Utility funds:

- Water Fund ½-yr revenues of \$1.06M are covering water system and storm drainage operating expenditures of \$.8M while strengthening a fund balance as expected to accomplish planned necessary capital projects. Revenue so far, this fiscal year is 3% better than planned budget, expenditures 4% under budget. More than half of annual revenue is typically realized in the first half of the fiscal year (July-November) due to outdoor irrigation during the hot weather of June-September. Rate adjustments are effective in January.
- Similarly, the <u>Sewer Fund</u> is covering operational costs and building as expected to meet the needs of planned capital improvements. Expenditures of \$586k are running 6% below budget against revenue which is almost right on plan at \$650k.

Approve a \$40,000 adjustment to increase the budget for the Fire Department, and direct staff to otherwise continue for the balance of this fiscal year as previously authorized and directed.
